

FROM THE DEAN

As the post-pandemic dean of the LA AGO, I will be strongly focused on giving and participation as we recover from the disruption we have endured since early 2020. The term "giving" most

Giving and "Stepping Up" Help Steer the Direction of the LA AGO by Getting Involved with Chapter Leadership

often brings to mind financial contributions which are an important way to give in order to ensure we are able to continue the costly programming and educational initiatives which enrich us as a chapter. But "giving" can be defined in many ways, particularly when considering giving of your time and talent. As I mentioned in last month's dean's letter, your presence is valuable in many

ways to both you and your fellow chapter members.

When attending the chapter leadership gatherings at the Seattle Convention and subsequent online gatherings this season, I have noticed there are a small number of common complaints among chapter leaders nationwide. One recurring theme is: "We cannot identify enough volunteers within our membership to help lead our chapter and carry out our events." This is not only a small chapter problem; this is an "all-chapter" problem. AGO chapter members are very busy people, many of whom are full-time or part-time church musicians with a demanding list of weekly obligations and a liturgical year to plan months in advance. Weeknight committee meetings or Saturday morning workshops and master classes are not what some of our members have in mind when it comes to resting at the end of a long day. But as we say from within, "If they only knew how much fun this is!" Those of us who have figured out how much fun the LA AGO leadership can be are still forging ahead with an aggressive season of programming and educational opportunities, small in number as we may be.

It is the case with most non-profit organizations that a large number of members do not actively participate. Many members do not regularly attend events. This does not mean our organization is unhealthy, it only indicates our organization is normal (although we can always do better). Within the membership of each organization, we will find a decent core group of members who attend events and take advantage of the opportunities we provide. Within this active group of participators, we will find a very small core group of people who are active leaders. Unfortunately for non-profit organizations across the board, we are finding our core leadership group is shrinking while our passive membership percentage is increasing. We are actively working to identify where the problem might be rooted: does the LA AGO not offer what its members desire? Have more than two years of pandemic habits given many newfound comfort as passive spectators? Has the technological age continued to starve our organization of the active attention of our membership?

Regardless of the reason why volunteer participation is declining nationwide, we need volunteers – we need you! Volunteering for a leadership role within the LA AGO is actually a lot of fun. It is an experience I will cherish for the rest of my life, and I intend to be involved as long as I am able. The LA AGO leadership group is an amiable family of like-minded musicians and supporters who enjoy working together. When you find the right fit for your talents, those weeknight committee meetings once per month become exciting opportunities for you to dialogue with your friends and colleagues and develop new ideas for moving the LA AGO forward as we rapidly charge into the 2020s with many new challenges and rapidly evolving solutions. It is truly exciting to begin with an opinion or an idea and work to develop your idea into a real initiative or project with the support of your friends.

If committee work or teaming up as a task force aren't your preference, perhaps consider volunteering to make our events happen, or volunteer to reach out to our members to help us stay connected with everyone. We have plenty of opportunities to assist with our dinners and guild recitals, educational events such as masterclasses and workshops, and we are even planning to host a playing competition next year which will require a sizable slate of volunteers to carry out.

So how does one "step up" to volunteer with the LA AGO? There are several ways to get involved. First, identify an activity or program in which you would enjoy participating and:

- Contact the dean or sub-dean to express interest in sitting on a committee or participating in any other leadership activity

- For the Executive Committee, which functions much like a board of directors, watch for the forthcoming call for nominees in the LA Pipeline

From my personal experience, I have made great friends and enjoyed many enriching experiences by volunteering for various chapter leadership roles. OCTOBER EVENTS WITH TYRONE WHITING

Masterclass - Saturday, October 15

Herrick Chapel, Occidental College Reported by Edmond Johnson

On the morning of Saturday, October 15, Tyrone Whiting led a masterclass at Occidental College's Herrick Memorial Chapel and Interfaith Center. The masterclass featured the 59-rank Crew Memorial Organ, built in 1966 by the Schlicker Organ Company. While reflecting many of the neo-baroque ideals popular at the time, the tonal design (created by Clarence Mader and Herman Schlicker) provides enough flexibility to convincingly perform music from a variety of eras.

Five local organ students were selected to participate. Nicholas Galinaitis, who studies with David Ball, began the program with a performance of the fugue from



Mendelssohn's second organ sonata. He was followed by

Patricia Wang, a student of Cherry Rhodes, who played J.S. Bach's Fugue in G minor, BWV 578. The third performer was Kevin Phan, a student of Lynette McGee, who played the entirety of Franck's Prélude, Fugue et Variation, op. 18. Following a short refreshment break, Schumann's Fugue on BACH, op. 60, no. 6, was performed by Daniel Parks, a student of Ladd Thomas. The final performer of the day was Kyung Hee Kim. Kim studies with Cherry Rhodes and performed Bach's Prelude and Fugue in D Major, BWV 532.

The organists were each allocated about half an hour to play the work that they had prepared, after which they were coached by Tyrone Whiting. Whiting began each time by asking the player to give a "self-diagnosis": How did feel about the performance they had just given? From there, Whiting would often focus a specific detail or passage that he wanted to hear again. Often, he would offer a demonstration on the organ or on a nearby piano.

Whiting made use of a wide range of pedagogical approaches. In one instance, he asked a performer to play a passage with an intentionally "ugly" registration to hear it differently. There was extensive discussion about bringing out the underlying musicality in each work, as well as many entertaining anecdotes.


The masterclass attracted a healthy audience consisting of both members of LAAGO and the larger community. The event was organized by LAAGO Education Coordinator Linda West Brown, with assistance from Scott Anderson, Kevin Cartwright, and Edmond Johnson. The organizers would like to express their appreciation to Tyrone Whiting and the organists who participated.

Anna Ferraro, a multi-talented musician, and singer-songwriter joined the LA chapter around 2008 and recently co-joined the Long Beach chapter. Over the years she attended local, regional and national conventions. For over three decades she has steadily played organs (and pianos) for worship services in Los Angeles and Orange counties for a variety of churches and temples.

This year has been especially eventful. In March she took the AGO service playing certification test, passing with high marks. Much credit is due to her teacher, organist Peter Bates. In July she attended the national convention in Seattle. On October 14 Anna released her sixth album of original compositions on all streaming platforms. In February Anna was recognized as a member of the Society of Women Organists, an international association based in the UK.

AGO members might be surprised to hear *Anna's Musique* is a jazz album. The music features her own songs and instrumentals accompanied by drums, bass, guitar, saxophone, and flute recorded at the 4th Street Recording Studio in Santa Monica with producer David Ross. 


LA BRONZE HANDBELL ENSEMBLE SEEKS CONCERT VENUES


SAINT CECILIA SING
