

International Laureates Organ Series Ken Cowan

Regarded as one of North America's finest concert organists and praised for his dazzling artistry, impeccable technique, and imaginative programming by audiences and critics alike, Ken Cowan maintains a rigorous performing schedule that takes him to major concert venues in America, Canada, Europe, and Asia.

A native of Thorold, Ontario, Canada, Mr. Cowan received the Master's degree and Artist Diploma from the Yale Institute of Sacred Music, studying organ with Thomas Murray. Prior to attending Yale, he graduated with a Bachelor of Music degree from the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia where he studied with John Weaver. Following initial studies with his father, David, his principal teacher during his high school years was James Bigham, Music Director at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, in Buffalo, NY.

In 2012 Mr. Cowan joined the keyboard faculty of the Shepherd School of Music at Rice University, where he is Professor of Organ and head of the organ program. He is additionally Organist and Artist-in-Residence at Palmer Memorial Episcopal Church in Houston, TX. Previous positions have included Associate Professor of Organ at Westminster Choir College of Rider University in Princeton, NJ, where he was awarded the 2008 Rider University Distinguished Teaching Award, and Associate Organist and Artist in Residence at Saint Bartholomew's Church in New York City.



The Laudamus Te Singers


At the last concert of The Laudamus Te Singers, on November 17, 2019, we announced that our next one would be on June 28, 2020—an all-Beethoven program celebrating the 250th anniversary year of the composer's birth. Like many thousands of planned concerts at that time throughout the world, that one was not destined to happen!

We are delighted to announce that on November 21 of this year, just over two years after our last event, this concert will take place at 4 p.m. at St. Bede's Episcopal Church. It will feature the magnificent Mass in C Major (Op. 86) and two shorter pieces. Although it is performed less frequently than the later

Missa Solemnis, it is a work that Beethoven himself was very fond of. It dates from 1807, the same year he composed the Fifth Symphony, one year before the Sixth Symphony and a year after the Fourth Piano Concerto, and it displays the same fully mature style found in these works.

Serene and poignant, Daniel Corral's new composition entitled **5** for **40** creates a soundscape for our disquieted times using repurposed organ pipes. From a church decades-since demolished, these pipes have been retrofitted to be human-powered, changing the nature and source of their sound. Synchromy has set **5** for **40** amongst the Tabebuia Trees of a quiet terraced garden. Bring a blanket, a picnic, a loved one, and join Synchromy for the world premiere of a new sound.

"I wrote the score for *5 for 40* in August of 2020. The skies of LA were a thick grey from the nearby Bobcat Fire, and the air was smoky. Whole charred leaves from the San Gabriel Mountains drifted into our backyard and, combined with half a year of pandemic isolation, made the world seem particularly apocalyptic. *5 for 40* was my response to that time, along with my continued interest in presenting music outdoors. The stillness of the piece hopefully offers an invitation to be present outside and just listen – to sounds both intentional and unintentional."


Full Scholarships Available MSM & DMA in Organ Performance at the University of Notre Dame

We are now accepting applications to our graduate program in sacred music for the 2022-23 academic year. Students in this program pursue a two-year master's degree in Sacred Music (concentrations in organ performance, choral conducting and voice) or a three-year Doctor of Musical Arts (concentrations in organ performance or choral conducting). Students also work closely with faculty in musicology, liturgical studies and theology. Our programs are broadly ecumenical, while giving specific attention to Roman Catholic traditions and practice.

We are extremely excited about what is going on here. The MSM students in organ performance play two recitals and the DMA students play three, one of which is a lecture recital. The studio meets weekly for an organ performance class, and the students have many opportunities to perform on campus. Students also take a four-semester sequence in creative hymn playing and organ improvisation.

All students receive full-tuition scholarships, health insurance, and an assistantship that supplies a generous stipend. Typically, an MSM organ student on an assistantship works in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart on campus, while DMA organ students are placed off campus in local churches.

Our Fritts organ and Reyes Organ Hall are stunning. In addition, the Fritts organ in the Basilica of the Sacred Heart was dedicated in January 2017. With the opening of our music building, O'Neill Hall, our practice organs have increased to six, and in total we now have fifteen organs on campus.

In this episode, Ken talks with host Thompson Howell about his childhood in Thorold, Ontario, Canada and growing up with his father and two grandmothers who were also organists; how becoming a concert organist wasn't inevitable; the one thing he missed most while teaching remotely during the pandemic; why he likes the comparatively small size of the organ department at Rice University in Houston where he teaches; and the ins and outs of assessing the needs of new students and developing their "musical personalities."

Ken also reveals whether or not he's a relaxed performer; how he prepares to play in front of live audiences; the best practice strategy for successfully memorizing pieces; the ways in which he helps to attract younger people to the organ; the one part of the world where there are organs that he hasn't played in yet; and plenty more!

Mader Composition Competition 2021

The Ruth and Clarence Mader Memorial Scholarship Fund has announced a Composition Competition for an Organ work to mark the 50th Anniversary of the founding of the Fund. The goal of the competition is to honor the Mader name through a work that will become a lasting staple of the organ repertoire.

Contestants are invited to submit a work of 8-12 minutes in duration, and based on the name RC MADER. Composers will be required to use the pitches: D C E A D E-flat and D-flat, notes derived from note names and solfege to represent the name MADER, including the initials first names of both Ruth and Clarence.

Ruth and Clarence Mader will always be an inspration to those privileged to have known them. The Fund is a response by students, colleagues, family and friends to widespread expressions of appreciation for the high ideals and artistic accomplishments of Ruth and Clarence Mader.

The Composition Competition was launched in January 2021, with a deadline for submissions on December 17, 2021. The winner will receive a prize of \$10,000, publication and a premiere performance of the work. Details of the premiere will be announced at a later time. The competition is open to residents of the United States (U.S. citizens, resident aliens, and international students residing in the U.S.) with no age limit. Compositions will be submitted electronically, and remain anonymous. Recordings, either live or via MIDI must also be submitted.

The Ruth and Clarence Mader Memorial Scholarship Fund is excited to sponsor this competition, as both the organ, and composition for the organ were such an important part of the Mader legacy. Our hope is that the winning composition will be an important and lasting tribute to their lives and work.
